

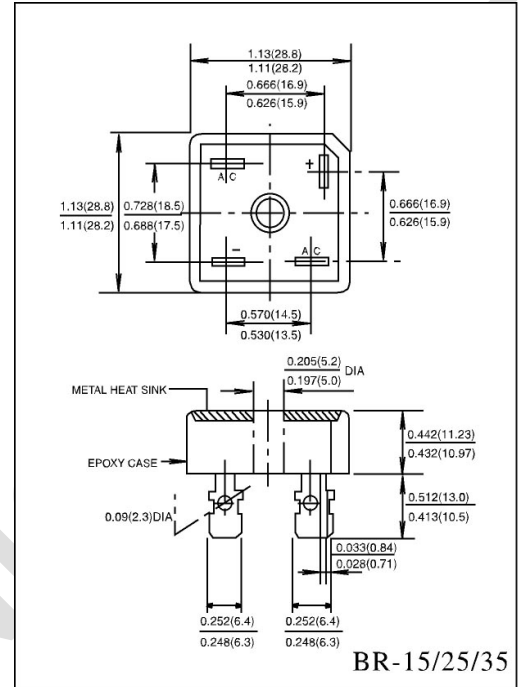
### SINGLE-PHASE BRIDGE RECTIFIER

#### FEATURES

- Low cost

- Integrally molded heatsink provide very low thermal resistance.

FIG.1-DERATING CURVE FOR OUTPUT RECTIFIED CURRENT

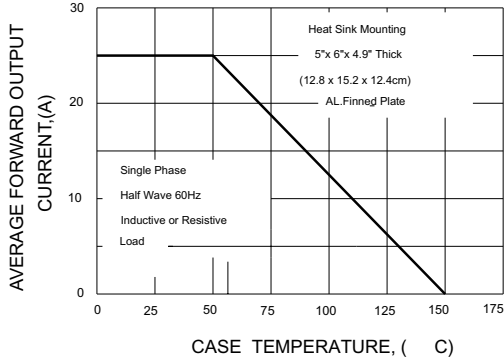


FIG.2-MAXIMUM NON-REPETITIVE PEAK FORWARD SURGE CURRENT PER ELEMENT

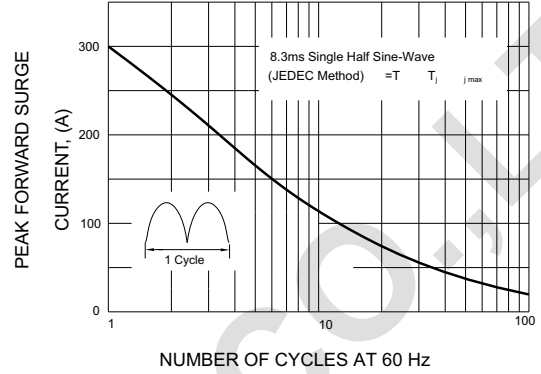


FIG.3-TYPICAL FORWARD CHARACTERISTICS PER BRIDGE ELEMENT

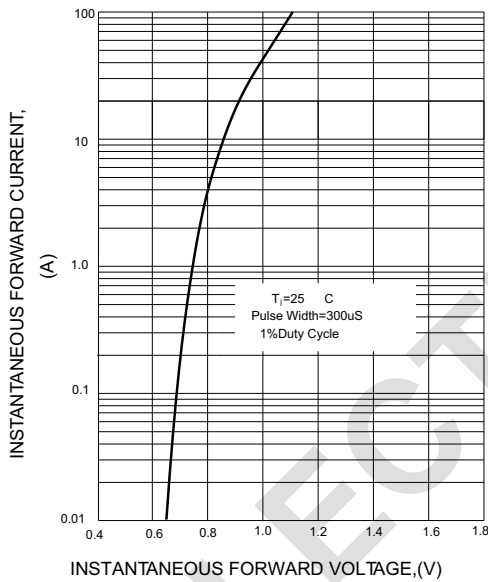


FIG.4-TYPICAL REVERSE CHARACTERISTICS PER BRIDGE ELEMENT

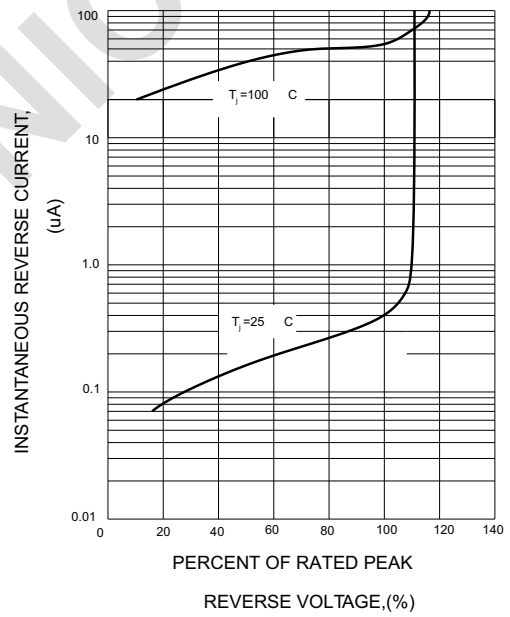


FIG.5-TYPICAL JUNCTION CAPACITANCE PER BRIDGE ELEMENT

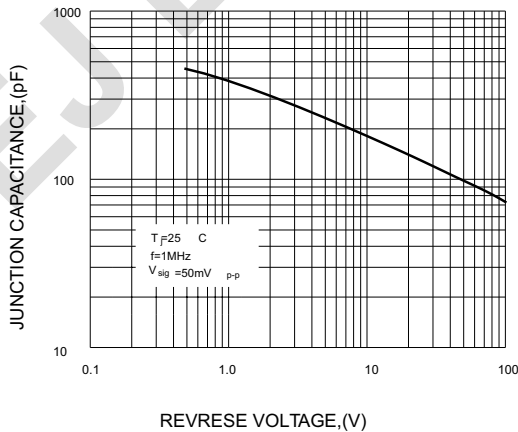


FIG.6-MAXIMUM POWER DISSIPATION
