




Figure 1. Forward Current Derating Curve




Figure 2. Maximum Non-Repetitive Peak Forward Surge Current






Figure 3. Typical Instantaneous Forward Characteristics




Figure 4. Typical Reverse Characteristics





Figure 5. Typical Junction Capacitance

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#### **Ozone Depleting Substances Policy Statement**

It is the policy of Vishay Semiconductor GmbH to

- 1. Meet all present and future national and international statutory requirements.

- 2. Class I and II ozone depleting substances in the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990 by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in the USA
- 3. Council Decision 88/540/EEC and 91/690/EEC Annex A, B and C (transitional substances) respectively.

Vishay Semiconductor GmbH can certify that our semiconductors are not manufactured with ozone depleting substances and do not contain such substances.
